# Introduction

---

This white paper presents new comparative data about 15 leading development banks' (and the Green Climate Fund, GCF) support of animal agriculture globally.<sup>[1]</sup> This includes the volume and value of the different development banks' support of animal agriculture and the geographic distribution of projects.

Support for animal agriculture can involve funding for the construction or expansion of breeding, rearing, and/or slaughter operations. Support for livestock value chain operations and activities can include capital to support large-scale soy, corn, and cereal production, fertilizer and seed manufacturing and distribution, irrigation system construction, and animal-based food manufacturing and logistics, including cold chain storage and transport.

As discussed throughout this paper, this research reveals a concerning trend toward support for the industrialization of animal agriculture.<sup>[2]</sup> This includes increased large-scale monocropping of soy and corn for feed, the construction of concentrated feed operations (CAFOs) that house hundreds or thousands of animals and pool GHG-emitting and water and land polluting waste in pits or lagoons, as well as slaughterhouses that are major sources of water and land pollution.

Whether via private or public sector investments, technical and advisory services, or development policy loans, development banks and the capital they mobilize [enable](#) the economic growth and entrenchment of animal agriculture, including industrial animal agriculture, or “factory farming”.

Livestock production can play a role in meeting the nutritional and economic needs of the populations whom development banks serve. However, the decades-long industrialization and globalization of the sector has driven the overconsumption of animal-based foods in higher income countries, while the diversion of resources toward feeding animals instead of humans has exacerbated food insecurity among populations in lower and middle-income countries (LMICs) who should be the beneficiaries of development banks' support.

The sub-sector is also characterized by corporate consolidation and control that has historically involved smallholder and contract farmer [displacement and impoverishment](#) in both [developed](#) and [emerging](#) markets, as well as land-grabbing and the [destruction](#) of natural resources on which traditional and indigenous communities rely.

Industrial animal agriculture is characterized by concentrated animal feeding operations (CAFOs) that house between hundreds and thousands of animals, large-scale slaughtering plants, and reliance on industrial monocropping to produce animal feed. All this makes industrial animal agriculture a top global driver of interconnected ecological disasters, including [deforestation](#), [biodiversity loss](#), [water consumption and pollution](#), and [arable land degradation](#).

In various regions, the negative environmental and social impacts of MDB-supported industrial livestock operations have given rise to local opposition. Examples include [MHP](#) in Ukraine, [Pronaca](#) in Ecuador, and [Alvoar](#) in Brazil.

Right now, some [governments](#) are grappling with the joint problems of overconsumption and overproduction of animal-based foods. As the same time, stakeholders from [academia](#), [civil society](#), and [development finance](#) institutions have advocated for the repurposing of harmful subsidies and the redirection of public support toward adaptive and resilient agroecological production systems, including diversified, mixed crop and livestock systems, silvopasture, agroforestry, and managed grazing. Scientists, nutrition experts, and economists alike have also advocated for the increased affordability and accessibility of plant-forward healthy diets.

This snapshot of MDB investments raises questions around what kind of agricultural operations MDBs should be supporting toward what ends. It also raises questions around the role of MDBs' public and private sector investments in [urgently adapting and transforming](#) food systems to respond to the numerous interconnected imperatives of climate change.

## Key Findings

---

- In 2023, the GCF and 11 of 15 development banks provided US \$3.3B of support for animal agriculture via 62 projects. An additional US \$3.4B was mobilized from other public and private sources.
- The World Bank Group, primarily its private sector lending division the International Finance Corporation (IFC), provided more support to animal agriculture in 2023 than any of the other development banks.
- Across the 15 banks and GCF, support for animal agriculture was geographically distributed. Latin America and Sub-Saharan Africa saw the most investment activity, with Honduras and Kenya benefiting from the greatest number of projects (5 and 3 respectively).
- Roughly half (54.8%) of the financing provided directly by the institutions analyzed for this paper supported private sector livestock operations; the remainder (45.2%) supported government-led initiatives that included at least some support to animal agriculture.<sup>[3]</sup>
- **More than three quarters of all projects (76.7%) targeted industrial animal agriculture.** Only 6.7% supported non-industrial activities. It was impossible to determine whether the remaining 16.7% targeted industrial or non-industrial systems, based on public disclosures.
- Disclosures lack specific information about activities to be carried out, the impacts of those activities, and development goals to be addressed.
- Disclosures are not always timely. In some cases, information is added to project disclosure pages after projects are approved. Even where project documents are available, it can be challenging for non-experts to interpret technical language and understand, in practical terms, the activities that will be carried out.

## Methodology Note

---

- Project-related data was scraped by the [Early Warning System](#) exclusively from project disclosure webpages<sup>[4]</sup>
- Projects were categorized as follows:
  - Relevance to animal agriculture (Yes/No/Unclear)
  - Direct investment in agriculture (Yes/No)
  - Direct investment in animal agriculture (Yes/No/Unclear)
  - If animal agriculture: what area(s) of value chain(s) / animal agriculture production system(s) being supported (e.g. farm-level production of feed crops or raising animals vs. trade policy or transport infrastructure) and what species
- We defined direct support to animal agriculture as projects supporting animal feed production and other primary inputs including animal health; animal raising; and slaughter
- The definitions of this analysis' "industrial", "non-industrial", and "unclear" classifications are available in Appendix I.

## Methodology Note: Approach and Limitations

---

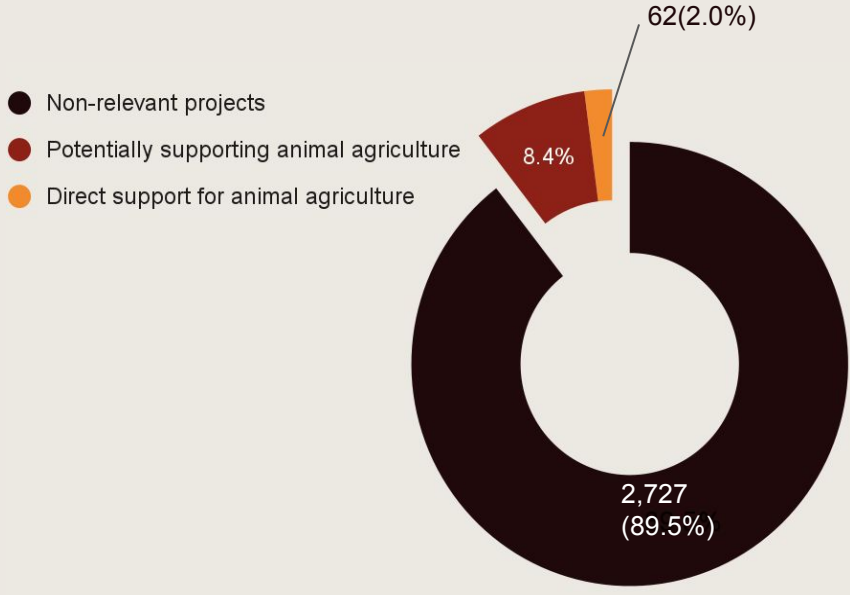
The number and financial value of projects may be underestimated due to a number of reasons, including the following:

- Project disclosure information is limited and inconsistent
- 2023 projects have been defined on the basis of when the projects were scraped from development banks' disclosure portals by the Early Warning System. Projects may be missing due to technical errors. Projects may also be missing because they were not disclosed in a timely manner.
- Projects approved in 2022 or previous years but not disclosed until 2023 may be included.
- Projects disclosed in 2023 but not approved until 2024 may be included.
- Manual retrieval and standardization of disclosures may have resulted in errors.
- Projects have been removed if they have been suspended since the disclosures were originally identified.

# Disclosures analysis

**At least 2% (62) of all 2023 projects directly supported animal agriculture.<sup>[5]</sup> A further 8% (257) may support animal agriculture but their activities could not be determined from disclosures.<sup>[6]</sup>**

n=3046



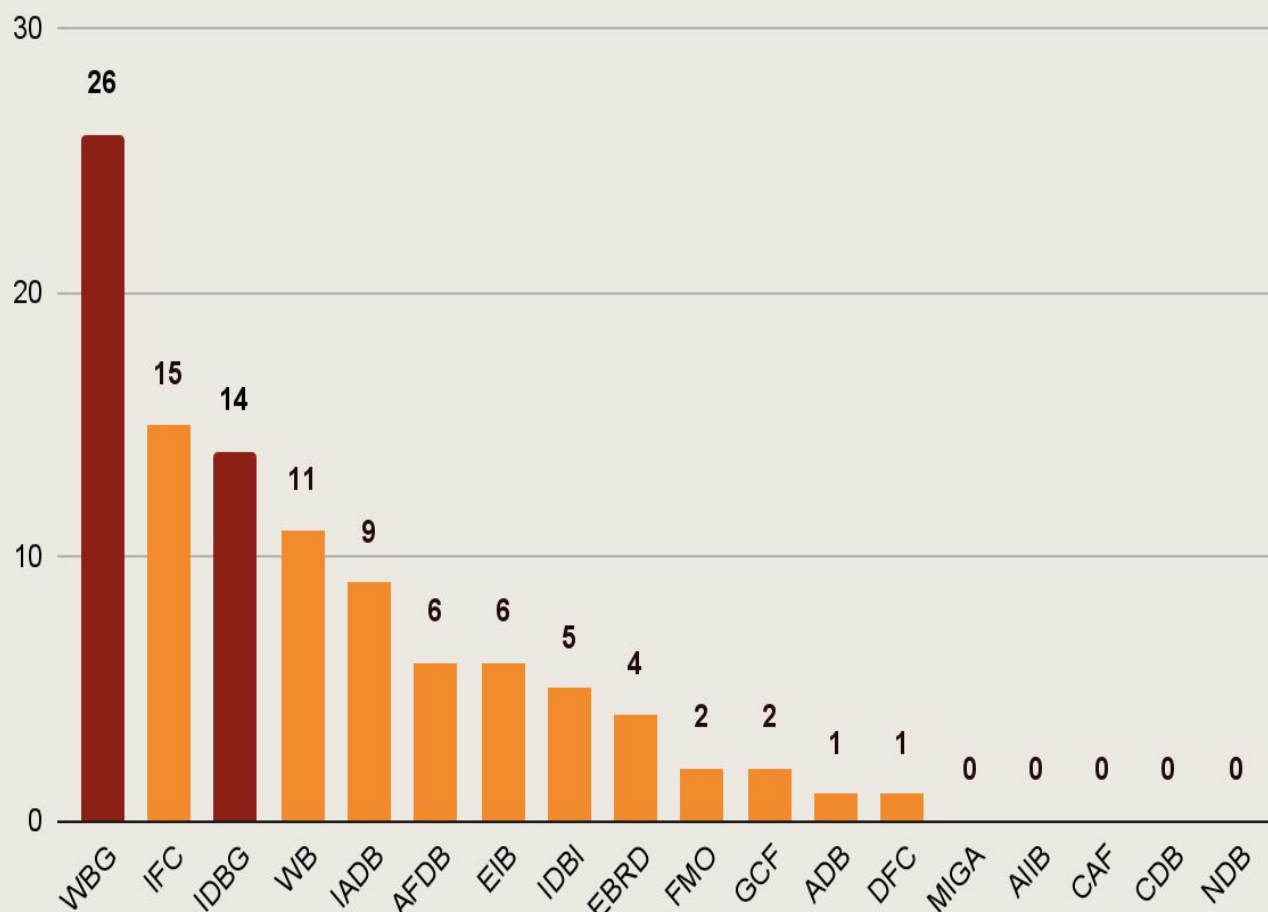
<sup>[5]</sup> Direct animal agriculture projects are defined as projects that directly support the raising of animals (production), primary inputs to animal production (e.g. animal feed, animal health and water), and slaughter/processing.

<sup>[6]</sup> Potentially relevant projects are projects that may be supportive of animal agriculture; in some cases, project disclosures do not provide sufficient detail to conclude positively or negatively. For example, projects broadly supporting agriculture or rural infrastructure development, where activities are not listed.



## The World Bank group provides the most support to animal agriculture, particularly its private-sector lending arm the International Finance Corporation (IFC).

# of projects, 2023. n=62

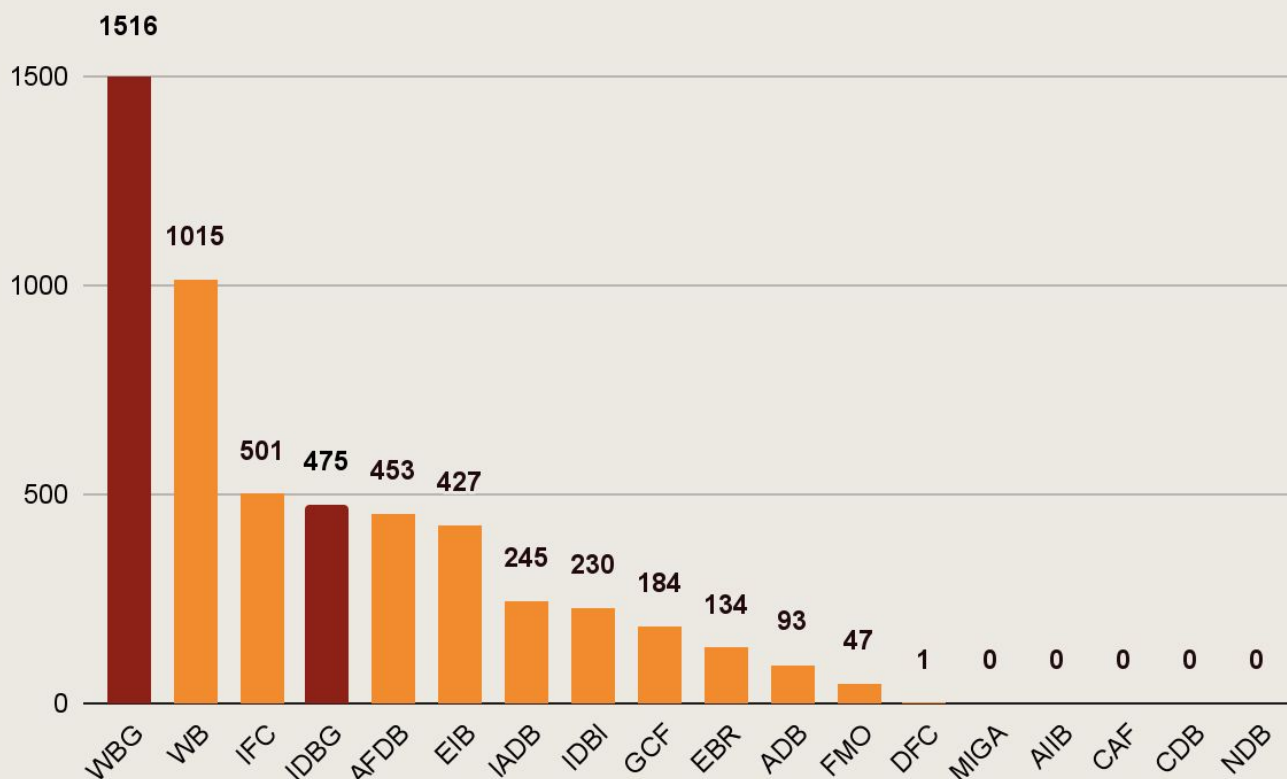


- The World Bank Group (WBG) comprises the International Finance Corporation (IFC), World Bank (WB) and Multilateral Investment Guarantee Agency (MIGA).
- The World Bank Group funded 26 projects in 2023, substantially more than all other development banks. This may be due to its size and global scope.
- The IFC alone funded 15 (private sector) projects.
- IDBG is the Inter-American Development Bank Group. This group funded 14 projects overall. This was led by public-sector oriented IADB (9 projects), not private-sector oriented IDB Invest (5 projects).

Note: 1) Projects may include multiple components and subcomponents, not all of which benefit or support animal agriculture. For example, projects that support livestock value chains as well as coffee and cocoa value chains. 2) The Caribbean Development Bank (CDB) was added to the Early Warning System data scraping and database only from May 2023. # The World Bank Group invested over 1.5 billion USD in projects supporting animal agriculture in 2023.

USD millions, 2023. n=62

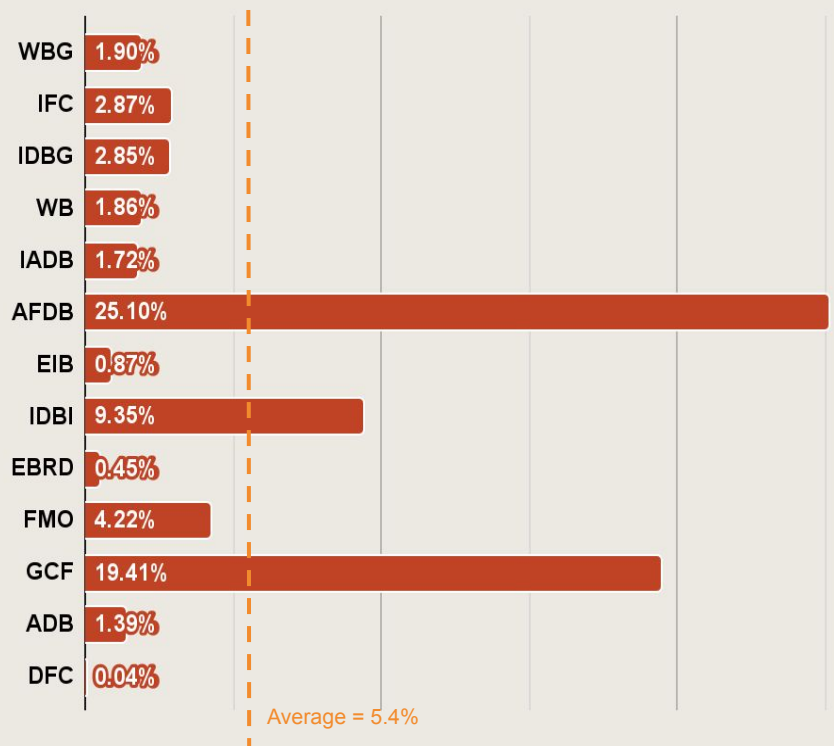
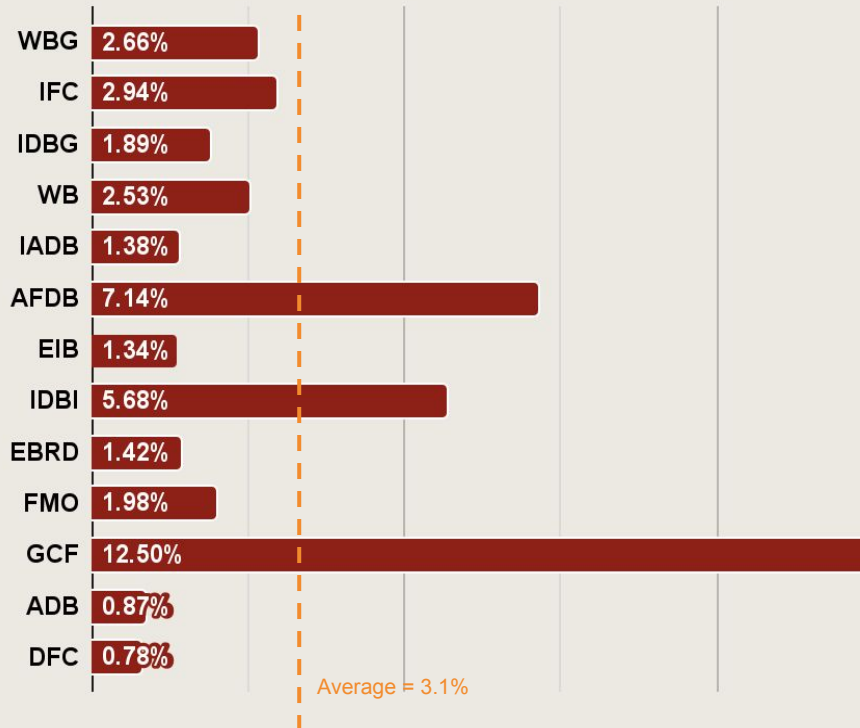


- The WBG and IFC represent the largest investors in animal agriculture by volume. World Bank Group average project value was 92.3 million USD.
- While IADB invested in a higher number of projects, these were of smaller financial value. Average IADB project value was 27.2 million USD.
- AfDB average investment amount was 75.5 million USD; for EIB, 71.2 million USD.
- AfDB, EIB have fewer and relatively higher value investments across supply chains (rather than in single entities).

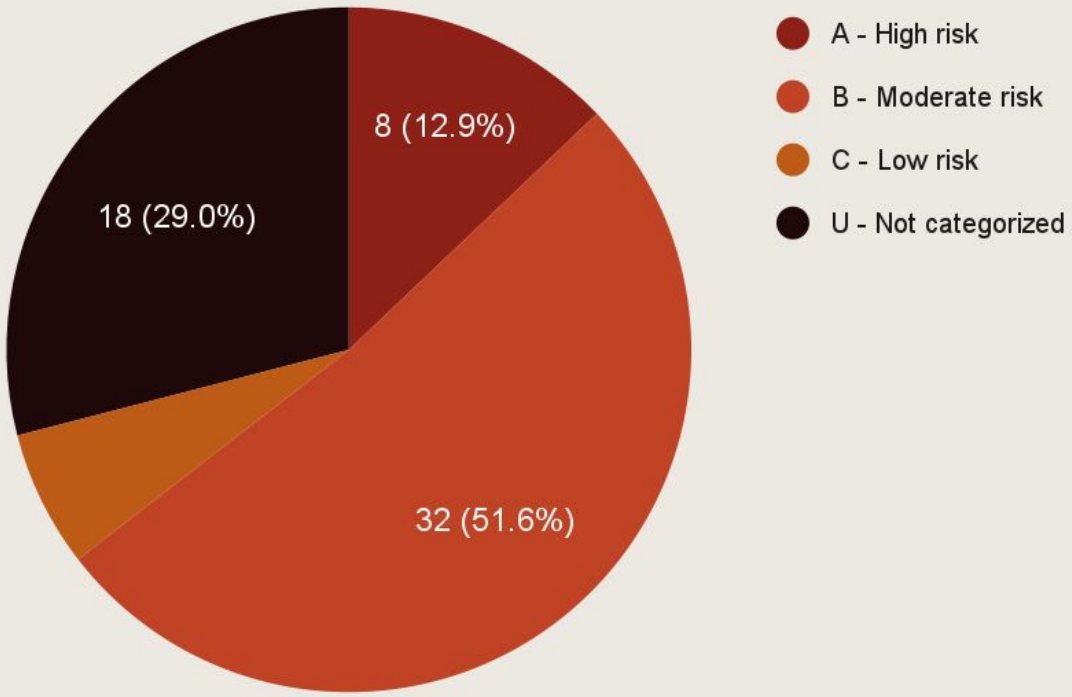
**The proportion of the World Bank and IFC's portfolios supporting animal agriculture was broadly in line with the majority. In contrast, African Development Bank (AfDB), Green Climate Fund (GCF) and IDB Invest (IDBI) support animal agriculture with a substantially higher share of their resources.**

**The majority of animal agriculture projects are assigned risk ratings that indicate banks believe projects have limited, site-specific, largely reversible and readily addressable social and environmental impacts.**

## Sub-Saharan Africa had the highest level of animal agriculture support activities from the development banks, in terms of both volume and value. Latin America was the second hotspot region for support.

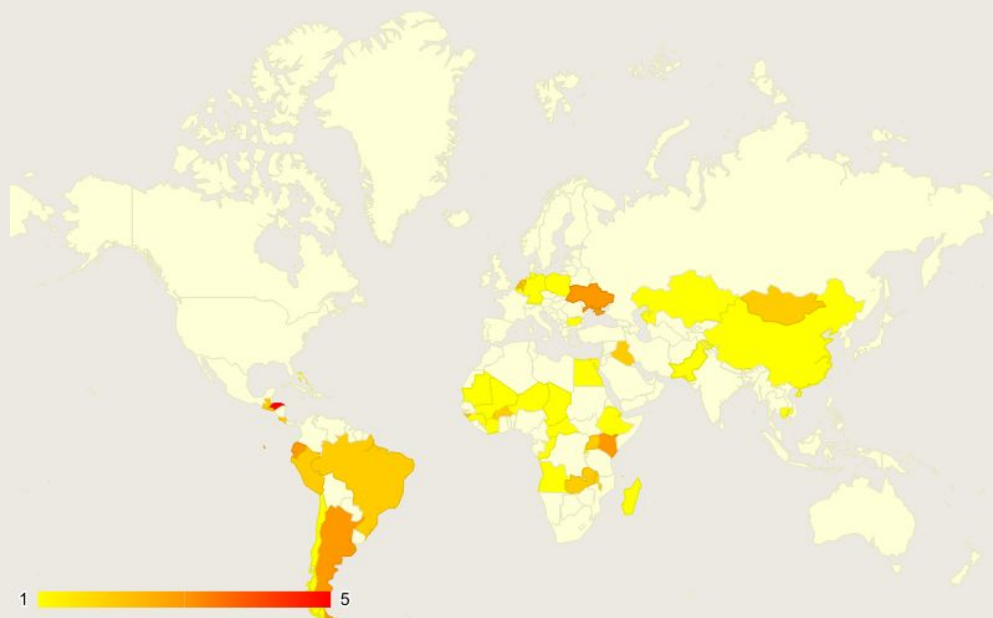

Global distribution of development bank-funded animal agriculture projects, 2023



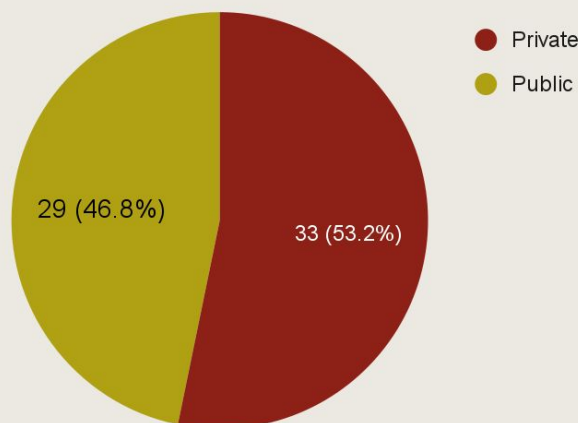

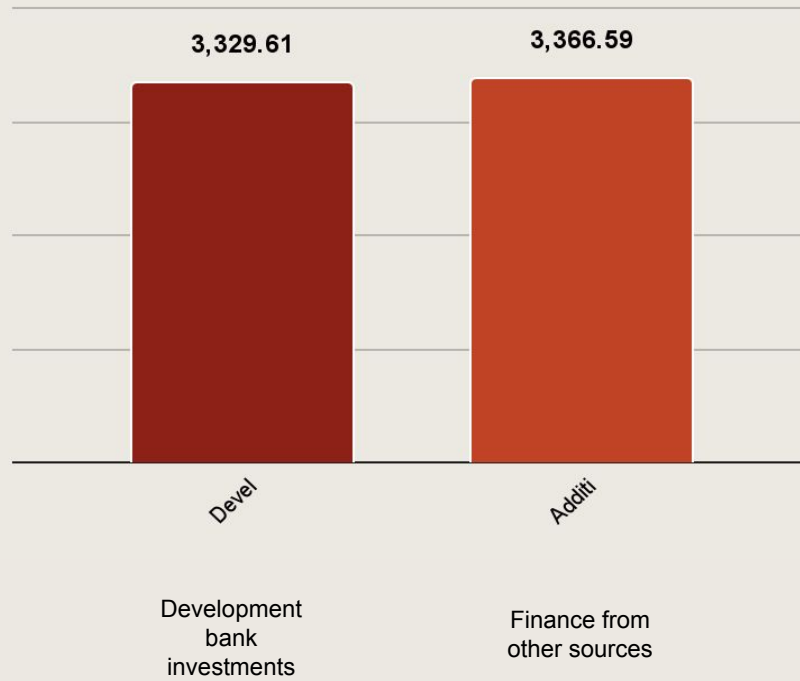

**In 2023, development bank investments supporting animal agriculture were doubled by funds from other financial institutions; governments; and/or project beneficiaries.**

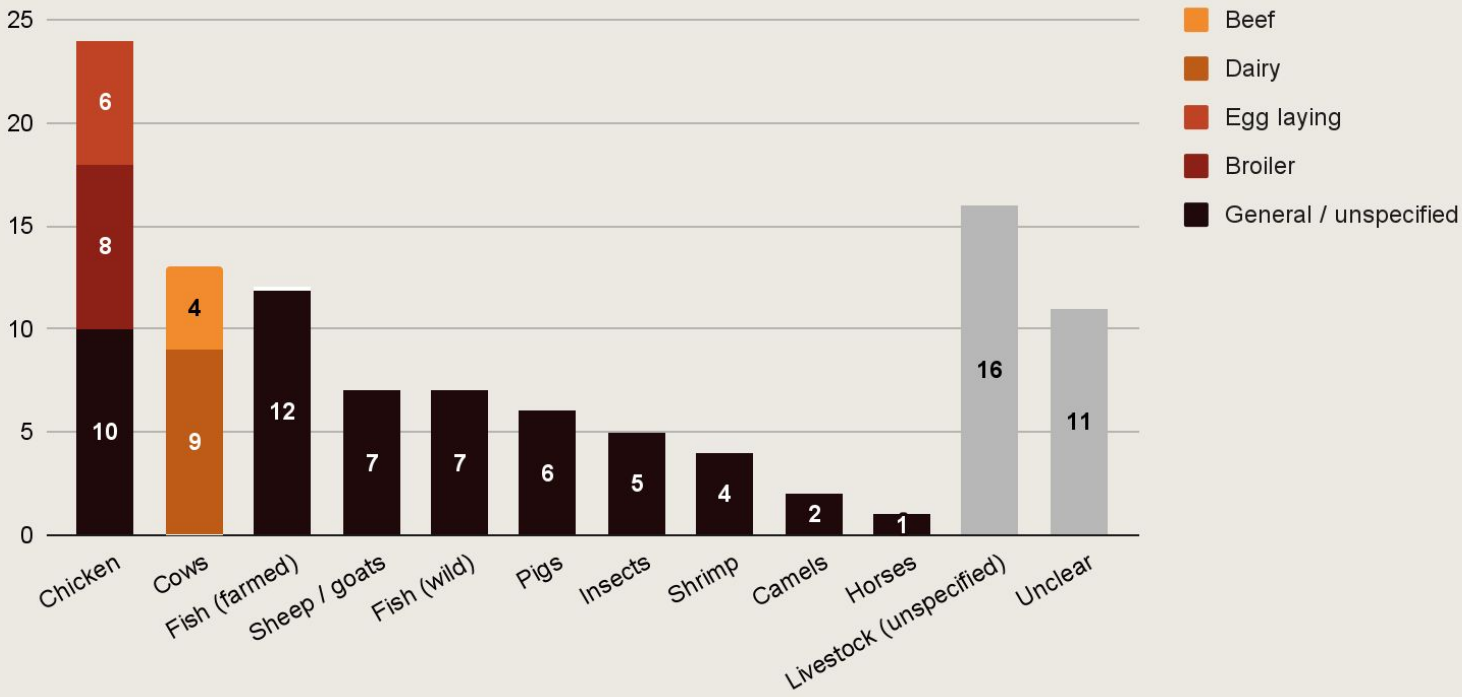
Projects supporting animal agriculture: bank investments and additional project financing

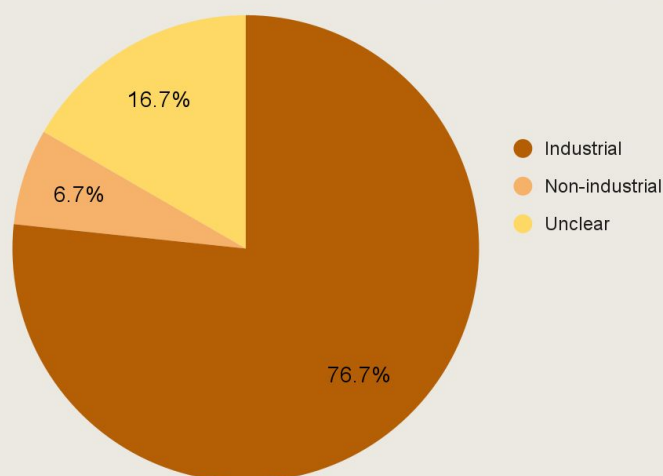
Animal species / production systems funded by development bank projects

# Additional analysis

Industrial / Non-industrial - by number of projects

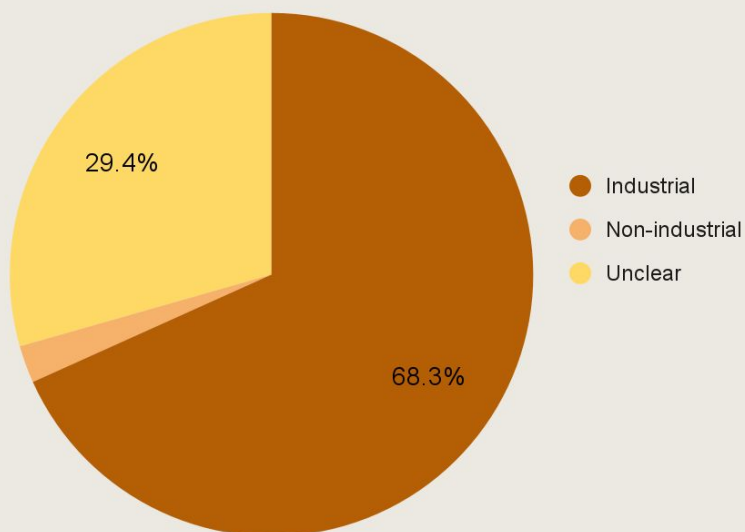

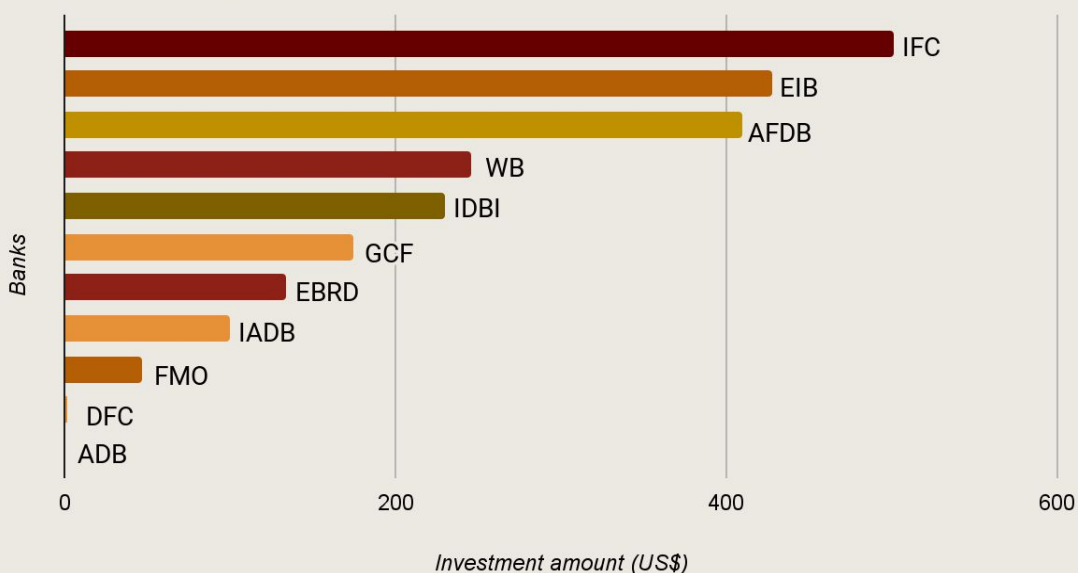

More than half (68.3%) of the total investments went to industrial systems (mostly private sector entities), while the amount invested in non-industrial operations was negligible (2.3%). Development banks also invested large amounts in projects that do (or might) facilitate the expansion of industrial animal agriculture. The largest investor in industrial animal agriculture projects was the International Finance Corporation, followed by the IDB Invest, and the European Investment Bank.

Industrial / Non-industrial - by investment amount



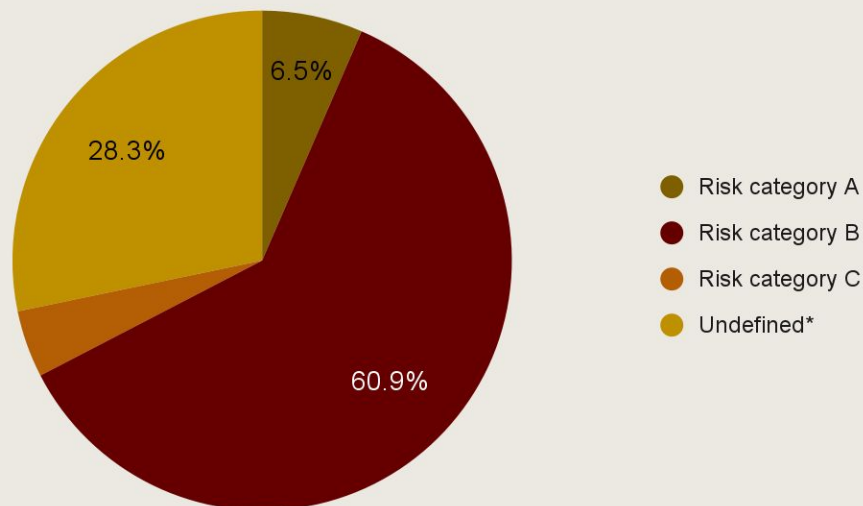
Industrial - by investment amount



**Development banks assigned risk category B (Moderate) to most industrial projects. Even when there appear to have been proper environmental and social impact assessments and relevant mitigation measures are in place, additional likely value chain impacts remain unaddressed.**

# Appendix I. Project Classifications

---

- **Industrial:** Projects classified as supporting industrial animal agriculture are those that relevant documents either explicitly state or imply support for concentrated/intensive operations or supply chain activities, including [projects](#) involving commercial scale farms, digital technology-assisted increased production, and vertical market integration.<sup>[5]</sup>
- **Non-industrial:** Projects classified as “non-industrial” are those the project documents for which either explicitly reference or imply support for small-scale animal agriculture and relevant sustainable practices, including extensive grazing. Examples included [backyard poultry](#) and [food crisis response](#).
- **Unclear:** Projects for which available documentation did not provide enough information to assess the project according to the categories above.
